Charles N. Coleman, 85, of Rixeyville died Wednesday, November 24, 2010. He was born May 15, 1925.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Edyth G. Coleman and oldest daughter, Cary Ann Lindblad.

Mr. Coleman was a WWII vet. He served his community as a Culpeper County Sheriff's Deputy for many years and was known to his fellow officers as 'Old Timer'. He was a loving father, grandfather and husband, and a worldly traveler who loved the outdoors and working with his hands.

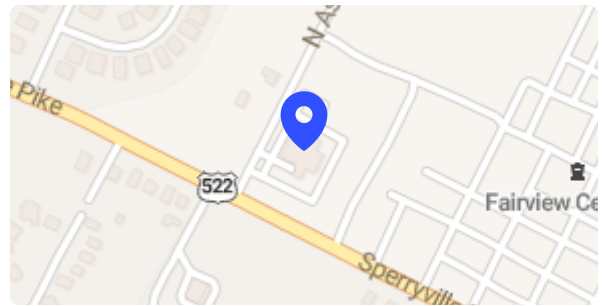
