Found and Sons Funeral Chapel of Culpeper is handling the arrangements.

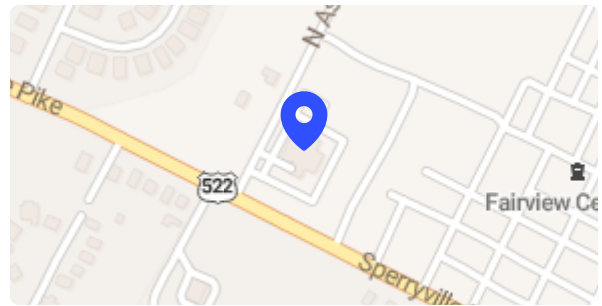
