# Wayne Michael Orme

APR 11, 1942 - NOV 3, 2014

**W**ayne Michael Orme, 72, of Culpeper passed away on Monday, November 3, 2014 at UVA Culpeper Hospital. He was born April 11, 1942 in Washington DC to the late Roderick and Alice Pettit Orme.

Mr. Orme resided in the Culpeper area for the past 12 years and was a member of Precious Blood Catholic Church. He was an active volunteer at UVA Culpeper Hospital and Culpeper Health and Rehabilitation Center. Prior to moving to Culpeper Mr. Orme was an active member of the Knights of Columbus at the Good Samaritan Council in Sterling, VA.

He is survived by one brother, Roderick Burr Orme and his wife, Carrol of Fountain, FL; and his nieces and nephews, Glenn Bucci and his wife, Diane of Pawleys Island, SC, Sharon Suess of Temple Hills, MD, Kevin Orme and his wife, Heather of Houston, TX, Michele Orme and her husband, Thomas Alcorn of Mead, CO, Eric Orme and his wife, Nicki of Panama City, FL and Michael Orme of Raiford, FL. Found and Sons Funeral Chapel of Culpeper is serving the family.






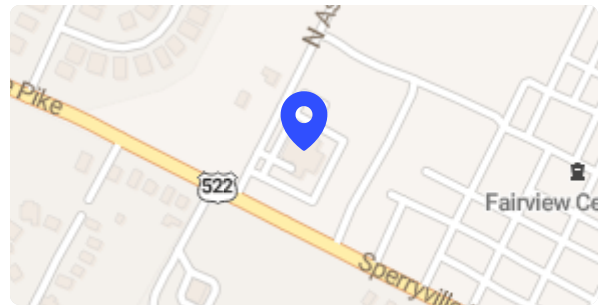

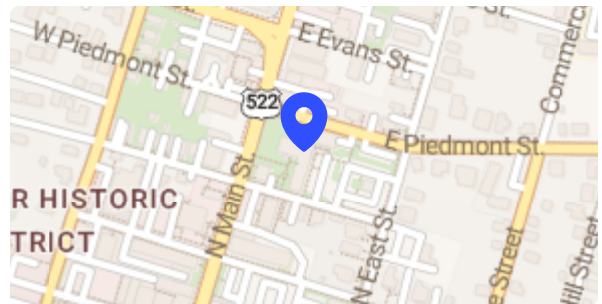

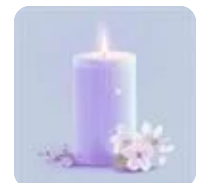
