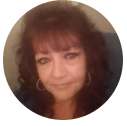

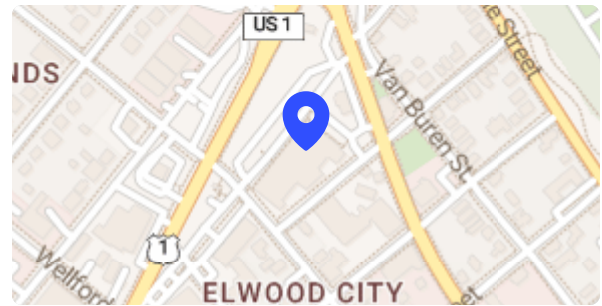

Several things were different those last couple days that Tammy & I & the grandkids have shared. We didn't know it but God was preparing the way for her exit from this old world then. Lois was my sister in every sense of the word. Lo I have been trying to be there for the kids. I promise you that for as long as they'll allow me I will be in their lives. I will try to pray with them, comfort them, cook them goodies, for as long as they keep me around.
