## **Earn Rudolph Yeargin**

**E**arn Rudolph Yeargin, 85, of Culpeper died Wednesday, January 18, 2017. He was born on October 3, 1931 in Louisburg, North Carolina to the late Robert and Ludie Stroud Yeargin.

He is survived by his wife, Darling Anderson Yeargin, two children, Dena Y. Lillard of Virginia Beach, VA and Barry K. Yeargin and his wife, Cathy, of Zion Crossroads, VA, four grandchildren, Cagney and Cody Lillard, Danny and his wife, Samantha, and Dylan Yeargin, and one brother, Carl Yeargin, and many nieces and nephews of Hampton, VA.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by one grandchild, Calley L. Lillard, and six siblings.

Earn Yeargin, best known to all who knew him as “Earnie,” began his adult life by serving in the army during the Korean War where he rose to the rank of Master Sergeant First Class. In honor of his service, he was awarded the Bronze Star.

Following his military service, he started his career with C&P Telephone Co. which spanned almost forty years. Earnie’s work ethic and dedication to his career was admired by all who knew him.

In 1955, Earnie and Darling Anderson entered into a marriage that lasted almost sixty-two years. Their love for one another was true and unbreakable. 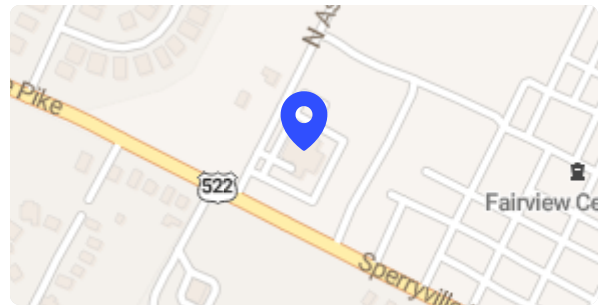
