Marianne Catherine Harmon, 61, of Fredericksburg Virginia, passed away peacefully on July 23, 2025.

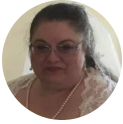

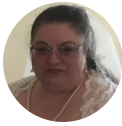
