It is with the heaviest of hearts that we announce the passing of our mom, Myrla Anne Martin, age 82, on August 19, 2025. Anne was born on October 1, 1942, to Henry Taylor Updike Sr. and Dora Nethers Updike. Anne grew up in Rappahannock before moving to Culpeper, where she married and raised her family.

Anne worked for the Culpeper School System for 45 years, spending most of those years in the transportation department, where she worked tirelessly to ensure the children of Culpeper County were transported safely to school each day. Anne knew every road in the county by memory and used that knowledge to route buses in the most efficient and timely manner. Her dedication to the job was truly unmatched.

When Anne wasn't working at the bus shop, she loved spending time with her children and grandchildren, working in her yard and flower beds, and going to the beach. She also never missed a sporting event or horse show if her grandkids were competing.

Surviving Anne are her beloved children, Frank Parker Jr. and his wife Kim, Philip Parker and his wife Lynn, and Cassandra Scott and her husband K.R. 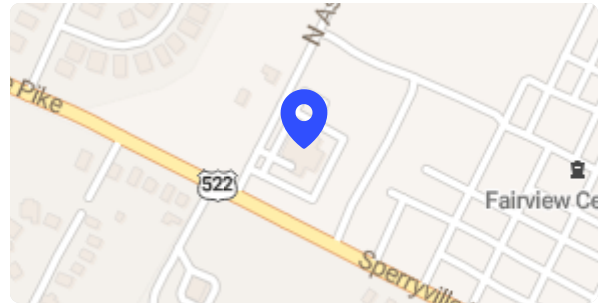

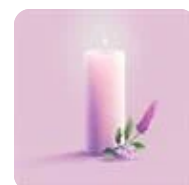

I worked with Anne from 1994 (when I started school administration) until she retired, but very closely from 2009 until 2016 when I had oversight of the transportation office. Anne was 20th century in how she drew out the bus routes on paper maps, but she was smarter than the routing software that replaced her. More importantly Anne could solve the daily puzzle of slicing and dicing existing bus routes to make a new one when a driver was out sick with no substitute or buses were on field or athletic trips to here, there, and yonder and we needed to get kids home. Anne loved the challenge of figuring it all out, and figure it she did. Anne would open the bus office in the dark of morning and leave in the twilight of evening. She would not go home until she knew every child was home safe after a day of learning. That work ethic was 20th century, too. Hearing Anne talk so gently and respectfully to upset parents was a marvel in human relations. She could have been a psychologist or a diplomat. Anne and my late father were both born in 1942, and both were raised in rural Virginia. They were of a bygone era. Neither had degrees on the wall or letters behind their name- but they possessed an intelligence that can't be taught. They put family and work in their forefront of their minds, at the top of their daily agenda, and in their hearts. Anne's passing is sad for me, but more so was her mental decline (just like my Dad's). I know how pridefully independent she was, so I am pleased that Anne is now free again to do as she pleases.
