David Pierson Zier, age 85, of Hagerstown, Maryland, formerly of Manassas, passed away on August 31, 2009 at Washington County Hospital in Hagerstown, Md.

Mr. Zier was born in Washington, D.C. on May 19, 1924. He was the son of the late Harry Franklin and Mary Katherine Quigley Zier. Mr. Zier was a United States Navy World War II veteran. He served from 1942 to 1948. He was the last known survivor of the U.S.S. Robalo Submarine. He retired as a guard from the Lorton Reformatory. He had worked for the Prince William County Sheriff's office and as Clerk of the Court of Prince William County.

Mr. Zier was preceded in death by his wife, Barbara A. Zier.
