Interment will follow in Fairview Cemetery.

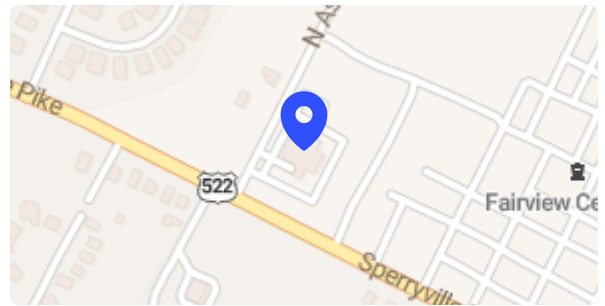
