Marvin Hamrick, Sr., 50, of Spotsylvania County passed away Saturday, June 22, 2019.

Marvin served in the US Navy for six years. He was a huge Civil War buff, a class A Journeyman Electrician, a member of IBEW Local 26 for more than 20 years, and a NASCAR fan. Marvin coached and was actively involved with his children's sports teams; and he loved spending time with his family and friends.
